Directions to Assessors and Tax Collectors.

THE KING, the Queen, the Diplomatic Agents of Foreign Governments and their attaches, duly made known to the Department of Foreign Relations, are exempt from all internal taxation. All property must be assessed in the district in which it is situated.

TAX ON REAL ESTATE.—Real Estate includes all lands and town lots, with the buildings, structures and other things erected or affixed to the same, and is subject to a tax of fifty cents upon every one hundred dollars of its assessed value. *Exceptions*—Real Estate belonging to Government, to the Board of Education, to incorporating to Government, to the Board of Education, to incorporated or private schools, to religious societies for church sites, burying grounds, and houses for education, and to literary and benevolent institutions.

TAX ON PERSONAL PROPERTY.—Personal Property includes all animals, household furniture and chattels not specifically taxed; goods, wares and merchandise; all ships and vessels at home and abroad; all moneys in hand and moneys loaned, all mortgages, public stock, stocks in corporations, exchequer bills, and every other kind of property not included in real estate, and is subject to a tax of fifty cents upon every hundred dollars of its assessed value. No person is liable to the Property Tax unless the assessed value of his or her real and personal property shall amount to one hundred dollars. Leasehold interest must be assessed as personal property against the owner of the beneficial interests therein. All personal property other than leasehold, must be assessed to the party in possession of the same.

CARRIAGE TAX.—All carriages and wagons drawn by one or more horses or mules, used for the conveyance of persons, are subject to an annual tax of five dollars each.

POLL TAX.—Every male inhabitant of the Kingdom, between the ages of seventeen and sixty years, whether a subject or an alien, is subject to an annual poll tax of one dollar. *Exceptions*—Clergymen of any Christian denomination regularly employed in their vocation; teachers of youth in public or private schools for more than six months of the year; soldiers in actual service; members of the fire department, and persons exempted by the assessor of the district on account of age, infirmity and poverty.

ANIMAL TAX.—All animals are taxed without regard to age. All horses, mares and colts, shall pay a yearly tax of seventy-five cents each. All mules and asses shall be yearly taxed fifty cents each. All dogs shall be yearly taxed one dollar each. Any person having the custody of a horse or other animal, subject to taxation, shall be deemed the owner thereof, for all purposes of taxation; but this shall not be construed to conflict with the law requiring konohikis to return a list of animals running on their lands, with the names of the owners thereof. *Exceptions*—Animals belonging to the Government; firemen are entitled to an exemption from taxation on two horses.

SCHOOL TAX.—Every male inhabitant of the Kingdom, between the ages of twenty and sixty years, whether a subject or an alien, is liable to an annual school tax of two dollars each. *Exceptions*—Clergymen of any Christian denomination, regularly engaged in their vocation; teachers of youth in public or private schools for more than six months of the year; and all students actually in attendance at high schools or colleges; soldiers in actual service, members of the fire department, and persons exempted by the assessors of the district on account of age, infirmity and poverty.

ROAD TAX.—Every male inhabitant of the Kingdom, between the ages of seventeen and fifty years, whether a subject or an alien, is subject to an annual road tax of two dollars each, or in lieu thereof, to six days' labor, of eight hours each, on the public road, at his option. *Exceptions*—Clergymen actually employed in their vocation; teachers of youth in public or private schools for more than six months of the year; students in actual attendance at any high school or college; soldiers in actual service; firemen, and persons exempted by the assessors on account of infirmity.

NOTE.—Hawaiian sailors, in vessels bound on foreign voyages, whether native or naturalized, commute for all their personal taxes at the time of shipment, and consequently are liable only for the tax on their real and personal property, their animals and carriages.

Consuls of Foreign Nations are not exempted from taxation by the laws of the Hawaiian Kingdom, or by the laws of nations.

The Assessors, before commencing their work, must each take the required oath, a copy of which is required to be sent to the Minister of Finance, as no assessor can receive pay for his services until a certified copy of his oath is on file in the Treasury. They must write their assessments and enumeration on the left hand pages only, and must foot all the columns except the two first on each page, and prove the footing of each, to avoid mistakes. When the pages are all footed and proved, they must recapitulate the footings by pages, writing only on the left hand page. They must in all cases describe the locality of the real estate assessed, so that it can be identified; and if the owner is non-resident, they must state the place of his residence, if known. If the tax payer owns but one lot of land, its assessed valuation must be placed in the column headed "Ka huina nui," etc.; but if he owns two or more lots, each must be described, assessed and specified separately, and the value of each placed in the column headed "Uku kupono," etc., and the total value of all the lots extended in one gross sum into the column headed, "Ka huina nui." When their books are complete, they must, before passing them to the Governor, take and subscribe, before a police or district Justice, an oath to be written on the first page of each book, stating, "This book is the assessment book for the district of _____ on the island of _____ for the year 187—. The assessors are instructed to use every means in their power to ascertain the actual existing value of real estate. In order to do this, they will have reference to the improvements thereon, to its capacity for production, its distance from seaports and markets, and such other circumstances as tend to establish such value. Where mortgages exist, the amounts thereof must be deducted from the valuation charged to the owner of the fee simple title, and assessed against the holders of said mortgages, under the heading of personal property.

The assessment of personal property should be governed by the same general rules.

SECTION 2. Every male subject of the Kingdom, who shall have paid his taxes, who shall have attained the age of twenty years, and shall have been domiciled in the Kingdom for one year immediately preceding the election, and shall be possessed of real property in this Kingdom to the value over and above all incumbrances of one hundred and fifty dollars, or of leasehold property, on which the rent is twenty-five dollars per year, or of an income of not less than seventy-five dollars per year, derived from any property, or some lawful employment, and shall know how to read and write, if born

since the year 1840, and shall cause his name to be entered on the list of voters of his district, as hereinafter provided, shall be entitled to one vote for representative or representatives of that district; provided, however, that no insane or idiotic person, or any person who shall have been convicted of any infamous crime within this Kingdom, unless he shall have been pardoned by the King, and by the terms of such pardon have been restored to all the rights of a subject, shall be allowed to vote; and no other persons than those qualified, as in this section provided, shall be allowed to vote at any election for representatives to the Legislative Assembly of this Kingdom.

SEC. 3. The assessors of taxes in the several districts shall carefully record upon their several assessment registers, in separate columns, to be provided for that purpose, according to the form immediately following this section, the names of all persons possessing the requisite qualifications for voters, as provided by sec. 2 of this Act; and if there shall be any persons in their respective districts who shall be possessed of the requisite qualifications to justify their voting, as provided by the 62d article of the Constitution, and yet may be disqualified by any constitutional reason, they shall note the same carefully against such name on the said lists in the column set apart for remarks.

SEC. 4. For the purposes of such elections, every tax-collector shall make out an accurate list of the names of all the persons in his district who shall have paid their taxes for the year immediately preceding an election, within the time prescribed by law, and who shall have been entered by the assessor upon the assessment register as possessing the requisite qualifications to vote, together with the names of all persons who shall have paid in to him their taxes within the time prescribed by law, who may possess the requisite qualifications to vote, but who may have been omitted to be entered by the assessor on the assessment register, as provided in sec. 3 of this Act; and in every such case the tax-collector shall enter upon the proper column of the assessment register in his possession, the nature of the qualifications of the party so omitted to be entered by the assessor, and who shall thereupon become entitled to vote at such election.

SEC. 5. Every tax-collector shall, on or before the last day of December of the year immediately preceding that in which an election for representatives shall be held, make out and return to the inspectors of election of the district, an accurate list of all the persons in the district who shall have paid their taxes within the time prescribed by law, whose names may appear upon the assessors' assessment register, as extended and corrected by the tax-collector, according to the provisions of sec. 4 of this Act, as possessing the requisite qualifications for voters.

The tax-collector, before commencing his work, must give the required bond. The tax-collector shall, upon the receipt of the amount of the tax from the owner of any dog, deliver to the said owner, a metallic tag, for each and every dog so paid for, which tag shall be stamped with the number of the year for which the tax shall have been paid, and stamped also with a number, which number shall be registered opposite the owner's name, in the tax-collector's book; the tax-collector shall also collect from the said owner, the further sum of ten

cents, for each and every tag given him as above. The amount received for tags must be accounted for with other moneys to the Governor of the Island. The owners of the dogs must affix the above mentioned tags in a conspicuous manner to the necks of their dogs, or else they will be liable to be killed by any police officer.

He is also authorized, in case he finds in his district any person or property liable to taxation, not enumerated or assessed, to make an enumeration or assessment of the same, and collect the taxes thereon in the same manner as if said person or property had been duly assessed. Such assessments and collection must be stated on a blank page at the end of his book, under the head of "Tax not assessed." He must write on the right hand page, opposite the name of every person enumerated, the kind of tax he pays, the amount of property, poll and animal tax, the school tax and the road tax, each in their proper columns. He need not specify the locality of the real estate, or the value of each lot separately, but must state the total valuation. When his collection is finished, he must add all the columns of each page, proving the correctness of each, and then recapitulate the footings by pages, writing only on the right hand page. The footing of the column headed "Auhau Kula," will show the amounts he must pay to the school treasurer of the district, and the footings of the columns headed "Houluulu ana o na auhau mua," and "Auhau Alanui," will show the amount he must pay to the Governor. Upon filing with the school treasurer an oath taken before a magistrate, that the amount of school tax stated in his book is all that he has been able to collect of that tax, the school treasurer will pay him a commission of five per cent. on the amount. Upon filing with the Governor a like oath in relation to the property, poll, animal and road taxes, the Governor will pay him the commission allowed by law on the amount.

The tax-collector is authorized to grant, up to the last day of November, to persons disputing the amount of their taxes, a certificate of appeal (blanks for which will be furnished) upon their paying to him, costs as follows: When the reduction or exemption claimed amounts to two dollars or less, fifty cents; over two dollars and under five dollars, one dollar; five dollars and not more than ten dollars, two dollars; and for every additional five dollars or part of five dollars, one dollar additional. All costs so paid, are to be returned to the parties appellant in case the appeal is sustained by the Board of Appeals, but if not sustained, the costs are to be paid to the Governor, to be accounted for by him, to the treasury, under the head of fines and penalties. The tax-collector may grant gratuitously, certificates of appeal from personal taxes only, to persons disabled by sickness or bodily injury.

The tax-collector is authorized to make such deductions from the taxes of parties appellant, as the Board of Appeals may direct; and in order to afford time for hearing all appeals, he is not authorized to commence legal proceedings against parties appellant to compel the payment of their taxes, until the 16th day of December.

Property seized by a tax-collector for payment of taxes, cannot be replevied at the suit of the tax-payer.

The tax-collectors are by law entitled to a commission of five per cent. upon all taxes collected by them not enumerated or assessed by the assessors.

Tax-collectors are entitled to commissions on all taxes recovered by suits, as well as on taxes voluntarily paid; and it is their duty to prosecute all suits against delinquents, to appear, with their books of taxation, against them, and generally to exercise all their diligence in enforcing the laws.
